Students and Faith Groups Unite for a Day of Action

The Third Annual Interfaith EcoAction Day will take place on Monday, May 20, 2013, (Victoria Day) from 9 a.m. to noon at Marymount Academy, 5100 Côte St. Luc Road, Montreal.

This event is an opportunity for Montrealers of all faiths and cultural backgrounds to rise above their differences and come together in shared action, united around a belief that we are all entrusted with the care of the earth. Events organizers use the words of Ghandi to remind us, “What is faith if it is not translated into action?”

Rain or shine, participants will meet at Marymount Academy, 5100 Côte St. Luc Road, Montreal, and work together to clean and beautify the school grounds and surrounding neighborhood. This event was organized in collaboration with Marymount Academy, the Christian Jewish Dialogue of Montreal, Eco-Quartier NDG, the Canadian Centre for Ecumenism/EcoFaith, Teva Quebec, and others.
